Callers' Corner

Bill Russell

Tradition is a double-edged sword. On the positive side, folks know their roles – where and how they fit in. It is very reassuring for an individual and for the group they are in. This is one reason why I love old-time square dance. On the negative side, if someone feels forced into a role, they feel trapped and not accepted for being who they feel they really are. We want to maintain our traditions. And we also want to welcome everybody into our dance communities.

Square dancers generally use gendered terms: "Ladies and Gents" or "Boys and Girls". A lot of dances and patter appear to be telling the men what to do: "Do-si-do your corner. She's the one in calico" – "Swing her 'til she hollers 'whoa'!" – "Chain the ladies" – "Take your Lady by the wrist and go around the next Lady for a grapevine twist" and so on, but not everybody enjoys hearing it called that way.

We are used to women dancing with women, often because there are more women than men willing and able to dance. Many of us are less comfortable with men dancing with men. However, men have historically danced with men in isolated lumber and mining camps or wherever there was a surplus of men. The dancer roles were well defined. Folks knew where they stood.

"Larks live on the left. Robins reside on the right." You may or may not have come across this terminology. It is being adopted primarily by urban contra dancers, but is also being adopted in smaller centres where contra dancing is popular. They want to welcome new dancers, anybody who might want to try it out. By renaming the Gents' role as the Lark and the Ladies' role as the Robin, they hope to be as inclusive as possible.

For those of us who have danced half a century to the calls we know, it can be initially confusing. However, for a newcomer it may be just as clear or even clearer: If I am dancing the Robin role, I am on the

right in our couple. If I am dancing the Lark role, I am on the left in our couple. When I end my swing, I will stand on my side of my partner.

I am not advocating that you change your way of calling if you and your dance community are doing fine. However, if you are in an urban area with plenty of newcomers, you might consider incorporating Larks and Robins into your calling: "Robins to the centre and back to the bar/Larks to the centre with a right-hand star..."

Traditions adapt to changing times.

Note: the original choice of terms was "Larks and Ravens", Ravens having the same vowel sound as Ladies, but it was quickly realized that ravens are held in high status in many indigenous communities. To be respectful, "Robins" is being adopted.


Our January callers sign up dance will be on Saturday, January 6, 2024, from 1-4 pm, at Westway United Church. Band to be announced.



Square Dance music is in units of 16 counts Figures are based on units of 4-8-16 steps Most patterns can be used in a large circle

Without music:
Join hands in a circle - partners not necessary
Easy walk or shuffle - do NOT skip or run
Circle to the left 8 steps - start on L foot
Pivot on 6th step- circle to the right 8 steps
4 steps towards the centre- 4 steps back again
Alternate men and ladies in the circle:
ALEMANDE - (h count flamme)

Alternate men and laddes in the circle:
ALEMMANDE - (4 count figure)
- Men turn right, laddes left, "Meet your Partner"
- Shake hands, hang on, welk around each other
(this is an Allemande Right)
-Men turn left, laddes right, "Meet your Corner"

- Shake LEFT hands, hold, walk around each other (this is an Allemande Left) Practice Call:

Practice Call:

"Allemande left with your corner
And allemande right with your own." (8 counts)

DO-SI-DO - (8 count figure)

Face your Partners, walk around each other
Pass right shoulders first, back up to place
-Mens' arms folded, ladies' hands on hips
Repeat with Corners

(Tradition passes LEFT shoulders on corner)

HONOURS - (4 count figure)

Man turns and bows to Partner or Corner
Lady turns and curtaeys

- Lady turns and curtseys

NOW - TRY ALL THESE FIGURES TO THE MUSIC:



PROMENADE - (16 count figure) - Walk beside Partner to the right in the circle - Two familiar positions: Skating: Join hands in front (R in L, L in R) Varsouvianna: R hands joined over lady's
R shoulder, L joined in front
SWING - (length depends on Caller) - Many variations (3 favourites): Ballroom: Waltz position, R hips adjacent Interlock: Man's R arm around lady's waist L hands joined underneath, lady's R hand on man's L shoulder Elbow: R elbows hooked, L hands joined above
- Buzz Step: ride on the R foot, push with the
L "as if riding on a scooter" Walk Around: walk around each other in a steps

BALANCE - (4 counts or "the phrase")

Step-swing Pas de Bas(que)

Forward and Back Step Dancing (phrased) (Step Dancing is varied - requires much skill) SQUARE DANCE FORMATION - SETS
- 4 couples in a circle, each couple face a wall
- drop hands, stand in 8 to 10 foot square
- lst couple has backs to Caller,2nd on the R - Couples are numbered counter-clockwise. NOW - LET'S HAVE SOME FUN SQUARE DANCING! when everyone is familiar with these -

- then try the following -

GRAND RIGHT AND LEFT or GRAND CHAIN
- Face Fartners, join Right hands
- Walk past each other (2 counts)
- DO NOT TURN AROUND - Let Go! Join L hands with the next person - Walk past, join R hands with the next, etc. Practice Call: "Allemande left with the corners all;
Right hand to partner, grand chain all."
RIGHT AND LEFT - (16 counts)
Two couples pass through each other, RIGHT shoulders passing (4 counts)

- Turn around as a couple (4 counts)

- Repeat back to place (8 counts) (Turn as a couple means keep lady on the R) LADIES CHAIN - (16 counts)
- Opposite ladies join right hands - Walk past each other, give L hands to the opposite men (4 counts) opposite men (4 counts)

- Men turn ladies around (4 counts)

- Repeat back to place (8 counts)

STAR - (4 or 8 counts)

- Usually done by 4 or more people:
Right hand: touch R hands in the centre
and rotate clockwise Left hand: touch L hands in the centre and rotate counter-clockwise






